RED BOOK® Deliverables (Micromedex) Updates Drug Pricing Fields

Effective December 2, 2016, new RED BOOK deliverables will be available with enhanced AWP & WAC Pricing Fields. The enhanced fields will shift to support 6 digits in the dollar place (eg, 999999.) to align these RED BOOK pricing fields with the National Council for Prescription Drug Programs (NCPDP) Telecommunication Standard. The decimal place values will remain static and keep their current formatting dependent upon the deliverable. Truven Health will continue to support current formatted RED BOOK deliverables for 90 days post December 2, 2016, in an effort to help the transition to the new formatting structure.

Clinical Manual of Child and Adolescent Psychopharmacology is a succinct and practical guide that enables practitioners to more effectively address commonly-seen disorders such as ADHD, gain new insight into high-profile problems like juvenile suicide, and become better informed regarding conditions, such as anxiety, that frequently go undiagnosed and untreated. The contributors review developmental aspects of pediatric psychopharmacology, address specific disorders in chapter-length detail, and discuss the pharmacotherapy of youths who are primarily seen in general medical settings, covering such conditions as functional somatic syndromes and somatoform disorders, eating disorders, sleep disorders, elimination disorders, and delirium.

PubMed changes

TUC Login & LinkOut to PubMed are temporarily unavailable due to the PubMed switchover to secure protocol (https). The Library has changed the link for PubMed on Databases A-Z to [the PubMed public site](#). This means that the links that show what TUC Library has in full-text will not be there.

Use the PMID search box in [Article Linker](#) to find whether TUC Library has full-text of needed PubMed article. If you have any questions or problems please ask one of the librarians for assistance.

Scopus to discontinue support for Internet Explorer 9

Starting November 3 2016, Scopus will no longer support Internet Explorer 9.

Scopus is in the process of updating its user interface to the latest technology, HTML5. Since older browsers like IE 9 do not support HTML5, which is the new industry standard for structuring and presenting content for the web, Scopus is will no longer provide support for IE 9.

In order for users to continue using Scopus' new features and functionalities, we recommend upgrading your browser to IE 11 or higher, use Google Chrome, or Firefox browsers.
