## News of Note

- The Library will soon be getting new carpeting, and electrical floor outlets will be added under the study tables. The work has not yet been scheduled - watch for further announcements on the [Library website](#).
- New shelving has been installed behind the Library service desk for the anatomical models and the reserve collection. Additionally, counter-height shelving was installed on the Library south side - the reference collection and the leisure collection have been moved to these shelves. - The Library will soon be getting a second color scanner/copier/printer in Room 205. Also, new window blinds will be installed in study rooms 201-203 on April 9, and new whiteboards will be added to all the Library study rooms soon.

- On Sunday April 28 we will be switching to the new 'enhanced' platform for [Exam Master Online](#), a tool that helps you review biomedical topics and prepare for exams including USMLE, PANCE, and NAPLEX. The vendor asks that you please do not use Exam Master on April 28 – you can try out the new platform at its new url beginning April 29. The changes on the student side should be intuitive, and a 'getting started' guide with screenshots of the new features will be available. Prior to the upgrade, faculty can attend a brief live webinar that demonstrates the new features that are available when creating and managing exams. ## Resource Spotlight: MANTIS

[MANTIS](#) (the Manual, Alternative, and Natural Therapy Index System) is a database that indexes journal articles from the chiropractic, osteopathic, homeopathic, and manual medicine literature from 1900-present. MANTIS addresses all areas of alternative medical literature, and its primary emphasis is peer-reviewed journal articles. There are more than 400,000 records in MANTIS from over 1,000 journals. MANTIS offers both [basic](#) and [advanced](#) search interfaces.

## Featured New Book

The Library recently purchased the 2-volume reprint of the complete colored plates that accompanied J.M. Bourguery and N.H. Jacob's **Complete Treatise of Human Anatomy**. This monumental 8-volume work, published in Paris between 1831 and 1854, is still considered one of the most remarkable works of human anatomy, and certainly the most outstanding example from the 19<sup>th</sup> century. The work was a collaboration between Dr. Jean Marc Bourguery, the initiator of the project and author of the text, and illustrator Nicolas Henri Jacob, a pupil of renown French painter Jacques Louis David. Jacob produced the 725 lithographic plates that accompany the text. For the first edition all the plates had to be hand-colored. The second edition, overseen by Jacob after Bourguery's death, utilized chromolithography which allowed for the printing of plates in color. The clarity, comprehensiveness, and detail in the plates are quite remarkable. See the two volumes in the Library's Reference Collection – call number QS 4 .B666 2012.
