News of Note

- [EndNote X6](#) – TUC has upgraded to the newest version of EndNote, EndNote X6, which can be downloaded by TUC faculty, staff, and students via Blackboard. Please read more about it on our [New in the Library](#) page, and contact [Becky Miller](#) if you would like help learning to use EndNote.
- The Library's copier/scanner has moved to our new Copy Room (Room 205) where you will also find a PC, a printer, and the virtual cash acceptor machine along with a heavy-duty stapler, hole punch, and other office supplies.
- The two vending machines have been moved into Library Room 204. This room also contains a small seating area for students to eat meal-type food in the Library. Larger dining areas are available on campus in Lander Hall and in Farragut Inn. Just a reminder that other than in Room 204 the consumption of food within the Library is limited to snack foods and beverages only. See the [Library Food Policy](#) for details.
- Reminder: One of the services the TUC Library provides is Interlibrary Loan – this service enables you to request a book, journal article, dissertation, etc. that we do not have access to at TUC. We will borrow this item from another library for you. Students are allowed 8 free interlibrary loan requests per academic year. - In an effort to make linking to full-text from [PubMed](#) easier, our [Article Linker](#) service will be integrated into PubMed in the next month. The integration will take the form of new TUC Full-Text buttons that will eventually replace the TUC Online Full-Text and TUC Print Collection buttons. We will alert the campus when the switch-over to the new buttons has occurred.
- [JAMA Network Journals](#) – The 9 *Archives* journals changed names as of January 1. Read more about the change and see the new names in [this article](#).
- Now available online in full-text is the new edition of the *APA Style Guide to Electronic References*, a complement to the *APA Publication Manual*. [The Guide](#) requires the following password for access: [please ask a Librarian for password]. Please note that this resource is for use by TUC faculty, staff, and students only, so the password should not be shared. Resource Spotlight: NHS Economic Evaluation Database

The [NHS Economic Evaluation Database](#) (NHS EED) from the UK National Health Service focuses primarily on the economic evaluation of health care interventions. It highlights and summarizes studies comparing two or more interventions or care alternatives. Studies are not limited to the UK. Both the

costs and outcomes of the alternatives are examined, and the evaluation includes cost-benefit analyses, cost-utility analyses, and cost-effectiveness analyses. The aim of the database is to help healthcare decision makers interpret the technical literature. As an example, on the topic of smoking cessation, NHS EED contains studies evaluating the economics of smoking cessation drugs, behavior therapies, health education programs, and other interventions. At TUC we access NHS EED on the EBSCO platform, but after you leave TUC this database can be accessed free of charge from the [NHS Centre for Reviews and Dissemination](#).
