## News of Note

- The Library will be collecting data on use of the Library Computer Lab from 11/5 – 12/5. We would appreciate if everyone who uses the Library Computer Lab would fill out a very brief survey. - This month the TUC Library, along with Touro libraries in Nevada and New York, is having a trial of [ClinicalKey](#), an Elsevier database. Elsevier is the vendor of many healthcare and scientific databases, including MD Consult, First Consult, and Procedures Consult. Elsevier plans to discontinue the MD Consult platform in December 2014, and is moving most of the MD Consult/First Consult/Procedures Consult content to the ClinicalKey platform, as well as adding additional eBook, eJournal, and video content. Please take this opportunity to try out [ClinicalKey](#) and test its features and capabilities, and then please give us your feedback by filling out this [brief questionnaire](#) by Friday, November 29. Your responses will remain anonymous and confidential, and will be used in formulating a product recommendation. - The TUC Library also just began a trial of [Bates' Visual Guide to Physical Examination](#). Bates is a product that we currently have available in DVD format and streaming. The new version of Bates is web-based, so the Mac incompatibility issues experienced with the streaming version will not be an issue. This product is brand-new - the original Bates' Physical Examination videos have been updated, and new, optional, OSCE Clinical Skills videos will be added (only one OSCE module is available during the trial). Like the ClinicalKey trial, we are soliciting feedback on Bates with a [brief questionnaire](#) that will be due November 29. The Library has on order the new book [I am Malala](#) written by Malala Yousafzai (with Christina Lamb), the 16 year old girl, who, when riding home on the school bus in 2012, was shot in the head by the Taliban because of her stand for girls education in Pakistan's Swat Valley region. No one expected her to survive, but survive she did, and she has gained world-wide recognition for her advocacy for education for Pakistani girls including a nomination for the Nobel Peace Prize. The impact she has had as a single young person has been quite remarkable. This is her story and the story of her family. The book should be available for checkout by the end of this week.
