- We are pleased to introduce our new Library Assistant, Dennis Forfa. Dennis will be working weekday mornings (7:15-11:15 a.m.), so he will help open the Library and staff the circulation desk during that time. He will also be assisting with numerous library functions, including interlibrary loan, receiving of library materials, and course reserves.
- Our Anatomy.TV subscription has changed. We no longer get Anatomy.TV via STAT!Ref – it is now via Primal Pictures on the Ovid platform. It should look very similar, but the modules we have access to have changed some. The modules that we have through Ovid that are the same as what we had from STAT!Ref are Regional Anatomy and Head and Neck Basic Neuroanatomy. We have lost access to some of the specialty modules as well as to the modules under Surgery and Sports & Therapy. However, we have added the 3-D Real-time Body. TUC has 2 simultaneous user licenses each for the Head & Neck and 3-D Body modules, and we share with other Touro campuses 10 simultaneous user licenses for the Regional Anatomy package. - Our subscription to STAT!Ref eBooks has also ended. If you used to go to STAT!Ref to access an eBook, try looking for it in the [TUC Catalog](#) since we may have it on another eBook platform. Resource Spotlight: APhA PharmacyLibrary

The Library recently initiated a joint subscription with Touro Harlem to the American Pharmacists Association’s [PharmacyLibrary](#), which includes textbooks (eBooks) published by APhA, including the *Handbook of Nonprescription Drugs*. The TUC College of Pharmacy has generously sponsored the TUC portion of the joint subscription for the first year. PharmacyLibrary also includes active learning exercises and case studies, as well as NAPLEX review, clinical and practice news, and more. Faculty can

For many, Temple Grandin, is the best known spokesperson on autism. Autistic herself, she has shared her personal insights and experiences and her knowledge as a scientist and professor in the 16 books and over 100 articles she has written in the fields of agricultural, veterinary and biological sciences; biochemistry and genetics. In her latest book [*The Autistic Brain: Thinking Across the Spectrum*](#) (Houghton Mifflin, 2013) she describes “every step of my journey” – from her birth in 1947 to today and how our understanding and treatment of autism has been transformed during her lifetime through scientific research and advances.
