The TUC Library now has two additional standing desks. Please do not lower the standing desks to a seated desk height, as the library has ample regular seating and limited standing desk availability.

We want to alert you to a slight change in the process of reserving a study room. The online reservation system will now require that users confirm their reservation by clicking a link emailed to your tu.edu email. All reservations will be tentative until confirmed. Any reservations not confirmed within 15 minutes will be cancelled and the time slot will reopen.

Please refrain from using the Library iPad charger for personal use. Unfortunately, removing the charger for personal use has occasionally caused the iPad to lose power. This interrupts patrons' ability to make study room reservations. Please help us keep the room reservation system consistently available by not removing the charger from the iPad at the circulation desk.
