## News of Note

- **Two New Electronic Resources!**
- **ClinicalKey** is a new resource that contains over 600 journals, nearly 1200 book, Drug Information, and Practice Guidelines and more! In addition Clinical Key offers tools to help build customized reading lists and build your presentations. This is a GoldStar database. ClinicalKey replaces two databases MDConsult and Procedures Consult which the publisher is taking off the market and expands on the contents in these two databases. MDConsult and Procedures Consult will be deleted from our TUC database holdings list at the end of August.
- **Sage Research Methods & Sage Research Methods: Case Studies (SRM)** is a research methods tool that integrates SAGE's book, journal, and reference content with videos and advanced search and discovery tools. Researchers can "explore methods concepts to help them design research projects, understand particular methods or identify a new method, conduct their research, and write up their findings." SRM can be used for the social sciences and the health sciences. [SRM Cases](#), an optional add-on, is a collection of case studies designed to help put abstract methodological concepts in context via practical examples. - **Cochrane Databases** will move from the current Ebsco platform to a new platform from Wiley Publishers sometime during the next several weeks. The result will be a new user interface to the Cochrane Databases and also access to some new Cochrane resources.
- **Chat Reference:** Please give this new service a try and let us know what you think! Note that you can still contact a specific librarian directly via email or chat using the links in the [Library Directory](#).
- **Interlibrary Loan (ILL) Policy Change:** As of July 15, 2014, TUC students and adjunct faculty join TUC faculty and staff in having access to unlimited free ILL service through the TUC Library. This policy change was recommended by the Library Committee and endorsed by the TUC Executive Council.
- **New roof for the Library:** The current Library roof is over 30 years old and has experienced numerous leaks in recent years. The FY14/15 Budget includes funding for a new Library roof. Construction will start by mid-September. It should take less than a month to complete the work.
- **New Ebrary Reader Coming:** One of the most common sources for electronic books for the TUC Library is Ebrary. Ebrary will be moving to a new reader the week of September 8<sup>th</sup>. At the same time Ebrary will be retiring the current app and replace it with the Bluefire app. See: <http://proquest.libguides.com/ebrary> for more details on the new Ebrary reader, and the TUC Research Guide on "Mobile Resources" on instructions for downloading the new app.
