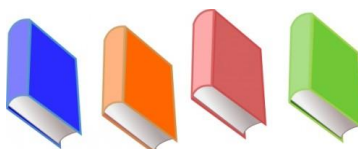

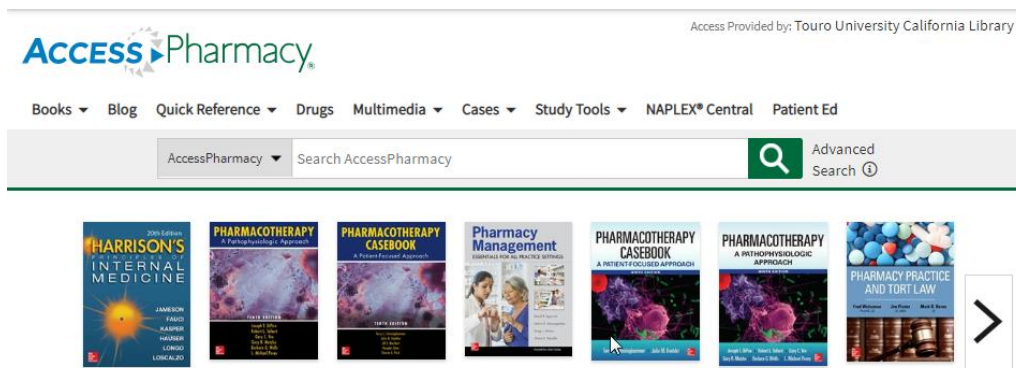

AccessPharmacy Webinar

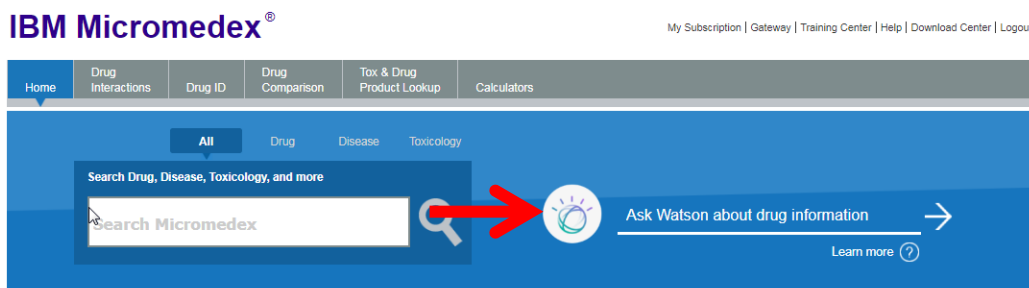

Featured Library Resource for Pharmacy: MICROMEDEX with Watson

Have you tried the new feature on MICROMEDEX called *Ask Watson*? You can find it to the right of the main search bar (as seen in the picture below). It differs from typical searches in that it answers questions about drugs posed in natural language, as you might do when searching Google. So, you can ask questions the same way you might ask your instructor, such as “what are the adverse effects of Prozac in teenagers?” and Watson will give you the answer, as well as direct you to the page in MICROMEDEX about the topic.
