News about Library Resources

New Journal

[BMJ Case Reports](#) offers a high volume of cases in all disciplines so that healthcare professionals, researchers and others can easily find clinically important information on common and rare conditions. All articles are peer reviewed, and BMJ contains the largest single collection of case reports online with more than 11,000 articles from over 70 countries. The Library has purchased an institutional fellowship, so TUC faculty, staff and students do not have to pay individual fellowship fees. Touro CA submissions are encouraged, and all TUC authors need to register once on the submission system (ScholarOne Manuscripts). New Database

[GIDEON](#) (Global Infectious Disease Informatics and Decision Support) is now available. The TUC Library purchased one user license. GIDEON consists of the following:

Infectious Disease Module – included here is information to diagnose, treat and track information on infectious diseases from around the globe.

- Generate a country-specific diagnosis based on symptoms, signs, and laboratory data.
- Display the epidemiological profile of a selected disease and generate a list of diseases that fit a given set of epidemiological parameters.
- Identify country specific pre-travel information for travelers and medical practitioners.
- Review the pharmacology and usage of anti-infective drugs.
- Review the pharmacology and usage of vaccines.

Microbiology Module – covers yeasts, bacteria and mycobacteria, and has an interactive function that allows comparison of user-selected organisms.

PsychiatryOnline Book of the Month

The PsychiatryOnline Book of the Month for September 2015, [Clinical Manual of Neuropsychiatry](#), edited by Stuart C. Yudofsky, M.D., and Robert E. Hales, M.D., M.B.A., is now available. This title focuses on the assessment, diagnosis, and treatment of the full spectrum of neuropsychiatric disorders, as well as those conditions that have significant neuropsychiatric components.

Several Noteworthy New Books in the TUC Library Leisure Collection:

On order for the TUC Library (let us know if you want this held for you) is the new novel by Anthony Doerr *All the Light We Cannot See*, which has won numerous literary prizes and wide recognition including the 2015 Pulitzer Prize for Fiction and the 2015 Carnegie Medal for Excellence in Fiction. The book set in World War II brings together the stories of blind French teenager, Marie Laure and Werner, a German orphan. NY Times Book Review describes the novel as “tackling questions of survival, endurance and moral obligations during wartime, the book is ... precise and artful and ingeniousalso a vastly entertaining feat of storytelling.”

(E 185.615 C6335 2015): Another book highly acclaimed and on various current best-seller lists is *Between the World and Me* by national correspondent for *The Atlantic*, Ta-Nehisi Coates. Inspired in part by James Baldwin's classic *The Fire Next Time* and a 2013 meeting with President Obama, Coates' autobiographical book, in a form of a letter to his 14-year old son, addresses what it means to be black in America today. It is an important and timely book for us today.

Electronic Resource Focus

Exam Master is a test preparation and study tool that contains practice materials for questions covering the biomedical sciences as well as practice question banks for the NAPLEX, PANCE/PANRE, and USMLE. Exam Master users can create their own practice tests from banks of questions and enable features such as an exam timing tool if desired. Students who register for Exam Master retain their access even after graduating.

This resource includes Faculty-level access that includes question writing and management tools. These tools can be used to create practice, study, or test materials for students and other registered Exam Master users. The Exam Guardian online exam proctoring tool from Exam Master enables students to take faculty-authored tests through Exam Master .
